

Lack of Access to Early Care and Education Hurts Working Parents & Employers

in Lincoln Parish

In Louisiana:

2 out of 3 young children have both parents, or their single parent, in the workforce.



Child care costs almost as much

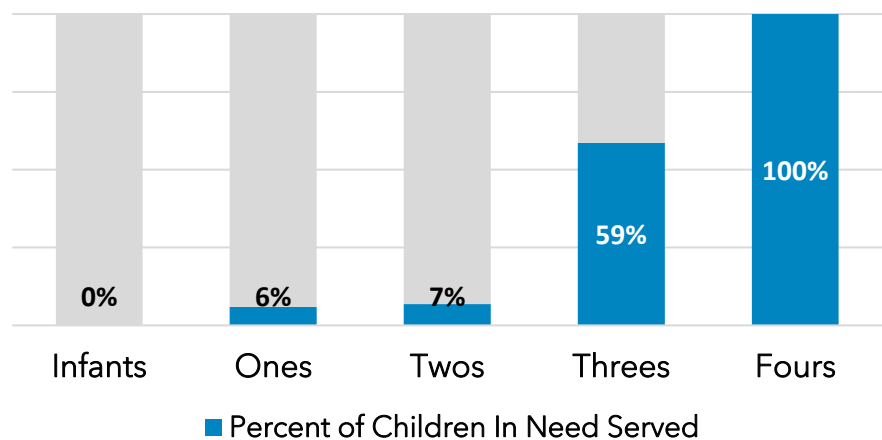
public college

In Lincoln Parish:

There are **1525** children in need birth through age four.

Yet **only 42%** are able to access publicly funded seats, leaving over **1000** children unserved.



The Impact:

Lack of access to quality, reliable child care for working parents:

Costs Louisiana employers **\$816 million** a year.



Results in a **\$1.1 billion** loss for Louisiana's economy.

Notes: Children served and unserved calculated from Louisiana Department of Education (LDE) October 2019 enrollment count and estimate of the at-risk child population based on the number of children in kindergarten. "Publicly funded seats" includes those funded through Early Head Start, Head Start, IDEA, LA4, NSECD, Pre-K Expansion Grant, and Child Care Assistance Program.
