LACK OF ACCESS TO CHILD CARE HURTS WORKING PARENTS

Across Louisiana, access to public pre-k programs for 4-year-olds has expanded greatly in the last decade.

Meanwhile, the **Child Care Assistance Program**—the only state program for children under age 4—has been **cut from almost 40,000 children to 15,000 children** served annually over the last 10 years.

Lack of access to child care for working parents costs Louisiana employers \$816 million a year.

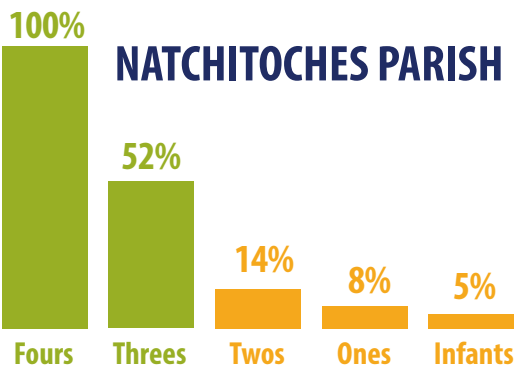


Two in three children ages birth to five in LA have both parents, or their single parent, in the workforce.

Quality child care costs almost as much as public college tuition in LA.

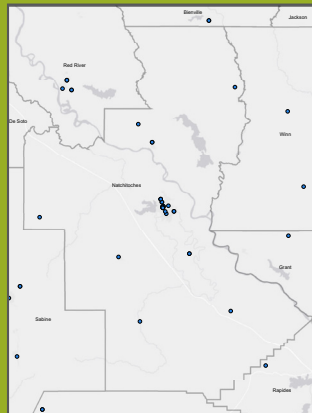


CRITICAL NEED FOR CHILD CARE: BIRTH TO TWO ACCESS



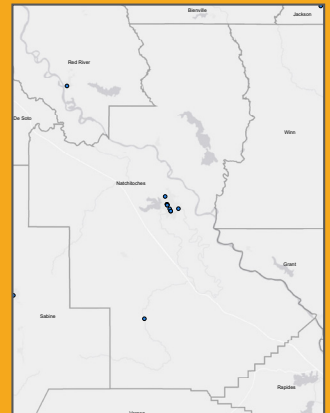
Percentage reflects the number of children accessing a publicly funded slot compared to the number of low-income children, by age.
